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

Coupla Slams by Steve Moese 5/13



E W Ν <u>S</u> 1N Ρ 4. Ρ **4** Ρ 5N Ρ 6N ΑP

Tuesday Evening was filled with slam hands.

Bidding - North opens 1N (15-17) and South with 15 Prime points uses Gerber to ask Aces, then invites Note that 4N by responder would be to play after the Gerber 1 Ace response - it is not longer quantitative. Why? Your side might be off 2

aces. Also note 5N invites only With 20 HCP opposite 6 here. 15-17, responder bids 5N immediately to invite 7N (5N cannot be passed!).

Opening lead: **Y**5.

Plan the play: Declarer has 9 tricks. Chances for 12 tricks depend on one of two good things happening: 1) ♠s offer 4 tricks or 2) ♣ offer 3 tricks.

The Play - Play 2 rounds of ♣s. when the ♣ A109 remain out, abandon the suit and play on ♠. You have to play to J or 10 singleton in either hand, J10 doubleton in either hand or 3-3 \(\Delta s.\) With the 3-3 split, 12 tricks come home. Post Mortem: Always look for the opportunities to add tricks to your total, and try them in logical order.

1)2♣ - 4-loser. Bid ♦ or RKB 2)4N - Blackwood. 3)1♦ - hope partner bids

(not the best choice). North asks Aces/Keys then Kings. If South shows one A & K, 7NT is easy. With a 9card minor headed by the AK, odds are the suit will run. The remaining 4 cards are likely split 1 1/3 each among the other 3 players.

Think NT with a running minor playing Match Point Pairs. Think safety when playing IMP Teams (+s as trumps). Getting to 7N was top score. 6N got you 70% of the MPs. Getting to any slam in the 149ers game was a top result. North has only 2 losers to eliminate. I like opening 4N Blackwood with this hand. 5 (1) will get 5N (Kings ask – then 7N when South shows 1). 5♣(0) gets 6. Count partner for 1 trick. Nice!



Tuesday 5/13 Good Technique by Steve Moese



Bidding – East has a classic Weak 2♠ opening bid. South's shape makes passing better than bidding with 12 HCP. Besides, partner has a chance to

bid. North, with 15 HCP and 3 suits to support, makes a text book takeout double. South now has a choice – which strain and how high. With 3=4=3=3 shape, we can't fault 3N. Our South jumps to 4♥, ending the auction.

Opening Lead - **♠**10, no surprise.

Play of the Hand – Count top winners: $1 binom{1}{4}$, $2 binom{1}{7}$, and $3 binom{1}{4}$. We have to develop 4 more tricks. $binom{1}{7}$ offer a 2-way finesse (you can finesse either West or East) for the $binom{1}{7}$ Q. We have 1 maybe 2 $binom{1}{4}$ tricks

(even without the lead, the 2♠ bid marks the finesse).

East wins the $\triangle A$ and continues a low $\triangle A$. When the $\triangle A$ holds, we can now go after the $\triangle A$. Since we know East holds A A cards, there is more space in West's hand for the A we finesse A

immediately. When the ♥J holds, we return to hand with the ♥K noting the 3-2 split. (If ♥ were 4-1 with West we can now pick up the suit with no losers). When ♥s split, we can lead a small ♦ toward dummy. This forces West to duck the ♦A (if not we get 3♦ tricks!). In dummy we draw the last trump and play a Small ♣ to hand and repeat the ♦ play. West ducks again. We continue with another small ♣ to hand and the 3rd and final ♦ toward Dummy's ♦J4. We guarantee 3 ♦ tricks by working our hand entries to lead toward ♦ strength 3 times. Notice if we instead lead a top ♦ from dummy, West wins the ♦A and the ♦10 might eventually be a trick. (Yes, we pitch the slow ♦ loser on the ♠K).

Post Mortem – Holding only 7 cards in a suit, a 4-2 split is 33% more likely than a 3-3 split. Good technique means leading low toward strength to avoid creating a loser when they spit 4-2. Force the opponents to play their high card on "air". ◆965 - ◆KQJ4 above informs how to play, say, ◆A32 - ◆QJ56 ←cash the ◆A and lead small toward the ◆QJ. Repeat if the ◆Q wins. That way you will have the best chance to win 3 tricks from this combination.
