Here's a hand that requires good judgment by both pairs – who will win the part score battle?

The Bidding: East passes (a weak 2♦ is beneath comment) and South opens a routine 1NT (15-17). West competes showing both majors.

North suspects ♣ will play, but a free bid of 3♣ is game forcing here! What to do? Thankfully NS play the Lebensohl convention – 2N asks partner to bid 3♣. Responder (North) will pass or correct to 2♦ to play (and bid 3♥ or 3♠ to suggest 3N if partner has the

 5 in the majors, "knowing" they hold 16 cards in both ♥ and ♠, bids 3♥ to steal the bid. South alert to the great ♣ fit (at least 10 trumps) bids 4♣ confident that this will make or go down 1 trick at worst.

**The Opening Leads** - ♥A, ♥K, ♠K in quick succession.

**The Play** – We see  $1 \bigstar$ ,  $1 \checkmark$  and  $5 \bigstar$  tricks, and need 3 more tricks. The  $\blacklozenge$  finesses offers a double chance – when right, South gets  $3 \blacklozenge$  tricks and can pitch a  $\bigstar$  loser. South can therefore win the  $\bigstar$ A, draw 2 rounds of trump (A then Q please, preserving the  $\bigstar$ 4 in hand) and finesse the  $\blacklozenge$ K. When that works, South returns to Dummy and repeats the  $\blacklozenge$  finesse, pitching a  $\bigstar$  loser on the  $\blacklozenge$ A. Losing only  $2 \checkmark$  and  $1 \diamondsuit$ , NS get a sound Match Point Score

- 2) Competing when they overcall our 1NT. Lebensohl is a very popular convention to deal with 2-level interference over 1NT. After their Double or 2♣ (showing ♣), our NT systems (Double = Stayman) are on. Over a natural 2♦, better bid 2♥/♠ to play and use 2NT as Lebensohl. After 2N opener rebids 3♣. Responder then
  - a. passes to play,
  - b. corrects to a lower ranking suit to play
  - c. corrects to a higher ranking suit to invite in that suit. Bid a higher suit at the 2-level to play! Lebensohl also lets us investigate 3N when responder does not have a stopper. An immediate jump to 3N says we have game values but responder does NOT have a stopper in their shown suit. When defending 2-suited calls, this would deny a stopper in BOTH SHOWN suits. (Say 2◆ shows ◆ and a higher ranking (unknown) suit. We can only talk about the suit we know, ◆). When holding a stopper, bid 2N first. Similarly, Game Forcing Stayman can be bid (though not applicable when LHO has BOTH Majors) showing partner no stopper (immediate cue bid) and a stopper in their suit 2N then cue bid – **Slow = Stop; Fast Denies**.

Note: if you do not play Lebensohl, then South should overcall 3♣ when East bids 2♥. This will allow North to place the contract! Giving up 2N invitational is a good trade for more accurate bidding in many more situations.

3) How high to Compete – No mystery here. With distributional hands and an 8+ - card trump fit, compete to the level of your trumps consistent with vulnerability. With 8 bid to the 2-level, 9 bid to the 3-level, 10 bid to the 4-level. With balanced hands, compete to 2N or the 3-level if you know your side holds 23+ HCP. Vulnerable? Avoid the deadly -200. See how the open game scores prove the MP addiction to 3N!
