This week we look at a hand where a help-suit game try leads to excellent results.

## Tuesday 7/22

Bidding - Most West’s with 11 HCP and 3 quick tricks (४A, AK) will open 1ヵ (12-21 HCP, 5+ hearts). East has 11 HCP and without heart support will show their spades with a 1s call ( $6+\mathrm{HCP}, 4+$ spades). West has spade support and a hand worth 13 support points ( 11 HCP plus 2 for the singleton). West will rebid 2 to show this hand. East with a spade fit in theory has 13 support points ( 11 HCP plus 2 for two doubletons) but in practice should not count all those jacks, especially the ones in the doubletons. This is still an invitational hand and in particular a hand that needs partner to provide help in West's second suit, clubs to make game. West can ask partner for help in clubs to get to game by rebidding $\mathbf{3 \boldsymbol { * }}$. This is called a help suit game try. If partner can help in clubs with an ace, king or shortness, they should go to game in spades, even if they hold a minimum. In this case West's club singleton is worth the raise to game in a 4a.

Play of the Hand - On a 2 (fourth best) lead, declarer has 5 losers ( $1 \mathbf{A}, 1 \boldsymbol{1}, 3 \boldsymbol{*}$ ). Assuming opponents win the $\$ \mathrm{~K}$ and then switches to a spade to cut down on ruffing in dummy, take the spade finesse and then finesse hearts. When South raises with the $V Q$ and the $\vee 8$ is played in North suddenly your heart suit looks like it can be set up. Take another spade finesse and play a second heart which South should duck letting North ruff and return their last spade. Win this and play to the $\diamond A$ so you can play another heart letting South win to set up your suit. You now have 4 spades, a club ruff, 2 diamonds and 3 hearts for 10 tricks or +620 .

Post Mortem - Help suit game tries can help you reach close games where you are worried about multiple losers in a side suit like clubs on this deal.
