

#### **NT Defense**

On this deal Tuesday night (1/6) everyone played 3NT in the South even though they have a spade fit giving the defense a chance to set the contract. West is on lead and has KQ1093 in hearts. What should they lead? With this four card broken sequence you want partner to play the jack right away so the suit is not blocked. You can signal this from the opening lead by playing the Q from KQ109. When partner sees the queen they can play the jack under the queen right away so West no longer fears AJx in South and can continue the suit to set the contract. This defensive carding also works when you have AKJ10x on opening lead. In this case you lead the king to ask partner to play the queen under it if they can. Both of these leads are shown as standard in the leads section of your convention card.
