## Hand of the Week

This week features a Tuesday hand where an overcall does not help the defense:

Bidding - I was North on this deal and with 14 HCP and a balanced hand opened my best minor 10 (1221 HCP, $3+$ clubs). East overcalls 1 (typically 8-16 HCP, $5+$ diamonds). Partner in South has 12 HCP without a four card major but diamonds stopped. He responded 2NT (10-12 HCP, no four card major, diamonds stopped at least once). With my 14 HCP, I have no issues raising to game in 3NT.

Play of the Hand - Since East overcalled $1 *$, West lead the $\$ 8$ (top of nothing). South has 8 winners ( $14,3 \uparrow, 4 \boldsymbol{4}$ ) and can only develop a ninth trick in hearts. South wins the first diamond in dummy and lead up to their hearts. East wins and switched to a spade but partner led back a diamond instead of continuing the suit. This allowed partner to play on hearts again to develop the ninth trick to make our contract before the defense could set up spades.

Post Mortem - At my table, the $1 \star$ overcall misled the defense to allow us to make our contract when most were going down in 3NT. When overcalling if you do not have an opening hand ( $12+\mathrm{HCP}$ ) it is important to have a good suit or you risk giving up tricks to your opponents on defense when partner leads your suit.
