

For non ACBL folks that want to become members we are offering a special promotion of five free Sat morning plays and one free duplicate game play when you join the American Contract Bridge League (ACBL). Dues for new members to the ACBL are \$29 and you can sign up before or after the game.

CBA Mentoring Program

Hand of the Week

This week features a Tuesday hand where 7NT makes but many have a hard time even getting to game.



EW 7N; EW 7♥; EW 7♦; EW 2♠; EW 2♠; Par -2220

Bidding – East with 18 HCP and 6 solid diamonds opens 1 ◆ (12-21, 3+ diamonds). West with 9 HCP and 5 hearts responds 1 ♥ (6-11 HCP, 4+ hearts). East is not sure of a heart fit but needs to show their strong hand. 3 ◆ is the most likely rebid (18-21 HCP, 6+ diamonds). West has a hand worth at least 10 support points for diamonds but will likely look to show 5 hearts with a 3 ♥ rebid or at some tables 3NT. If 3NT is bid it will play there. If 3 ♥, East has a hand worth at least 20 support points (18 HCP plus 2 more for the singleton) but will likely settle for a 4 ♥ game.



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
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Play of the Hand – Assuming a 4♥ contract, Expect a ♠K lead (K from KQ). West has 5 losers (1♠, 1♥, 3♠). They can finesse for the ♥Q and can pitch 4 losers on running diamonds. The best play is to draw trump and then runs diamonds. Generally speaking the best chance to capture the ♥Q is to finesse which fails on this lay of the cards allowing the opponents to also win a spade giving declarer 11 tricks for +650. If you go against the odds and try to drop the queen, this time you are richly rewarded with making all 13 tricks for +710.

For 3NT - If you decided to play 3NT and get a club lead you will try to cash your 10 winners (1♠, 2♥, 6♦, 1♣), drop the ♥Q in the process and collect three more hearts for +720.

Post Mortem – When you have a big hand like East on this deal, you need to jump rebid to show strength to partner. If you only rebid 2♦ on this deal likely you will play there missing an easy game.

Post Mortem 2 – Why not play slam when 7♥ or 7NT makes? On this deal it is hard to communicate slam values between the two hands when your trump suit is agreed to at the 4 level. Besides, a slam is 50/50 on this deal on a spade lead (or clubs for 7NT) dependent on declarer finding the ♥Q.
