## Hand of the Week

This week features a Tuesday night hand that shows us the power of overcalling:

Bidding - South with 13 HCP opens 12 (12-21 HCP, $3+$ clubs). I hold the West hand with 10 HCP and a solid 5 card diamond suit. Since I was so weak in the majors and solid in my suit I decided to treat this hand like a preempt and overcalled $2 \star$ ( $5-11 \mathrm{HCP}, 6+$ cards). Under pressure, North with 5 hearts and 7 HCP decided to respond $2 \vee$ ( $9-11$ HCP as a passed hand, $5+$ hearts). My partner with a great hand for diamonds but knowing I am a weak hand made a simple raise to $3 \downarrow$. South with 4 hearts for partner but minimum values appropriately competed to $3 \vee$. What if West overcalls 14: North has a much easier bid of 1v (6-11 HCP, 4+ hearts). West will likely bid
$2 \diamond$ (6-9 HCP, 3+ diamonds). South will bid $2 \vee$ (12-14 support points, 4 hearts) and it will play there unless West competes to $3 \star$. If they do $\mathrm{N}-\mathrm{S}$ are likely to go to $3 \checkmark$ with their 9 trumps.

Play of the Hand - Partner led the $\uparrow A$ from AK hoping to catch me with a doubleton for a quick ruff. On the opening lead I played a 2 . We play standard defensive carding so partner knew I did not want spades and switched to my diamond suit. Later on we win a trump trick, cash a diamond and a spade putting declarer back in with a diamond. When declarer plays on clubs West must cover the \& with their king (Covering an honor with an honor) when played from the South hand to get the setting trick and +50 for $\mathrm{E}-\mathrm{W}$.

Post Mortem - This is not a glamorous hand but one that plays out frequently at the table. With a solid suit it is critical to get into the auction after the opponents open as I did on this deal. Not only does it push the opponents to a higher level it tells partner what they can lead on defense.

Post Mortem II - On defense make sure to cover an honor with an honor when it's appropriate. When West covers the $Q$ with the king the $A$ and $Q$ in the opponent's hand fall on the same trick ultimately promoting the 10 for the defense on the third round of clubs. If West ducks the 2 , declarer wins the $\&$, eJ and 4 for all three clubs tricks and +140 score.
