## Hand of the Week

This week features a hand that looks like a preempt at first glance but is much more than that:



EW 4♠; NS 4♥; NS 3N; NS 4♦; EW 1♣; Par -100: NS 4N×-1; NS 5♦×-1; NS 5♥×-1

**Bidding** – South with 14 HCP and 5 hearts will open 1♥ (12-21 HCP, 5+ hearts). West has 10 HCP and 7 spades. On most hands West would make a preemptive 3♠ overcall with their 7 card suit. Not this hand though. This hand with a 7-1-1-4 pattern and KQs in both long suits is worth much more. At worst the opponents can take four tricks off the top. If we catch partner with at least 1 ace and couple spades we have play to make game. Even if partner has nothing going down in 4♠ is much better than letting the opponents make game in hearts or NT. Therefore our best bid is 4♠ directly.


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Play of the Hand – Assuming a ♥4 lead (middle from three small to partners suit, also called a MUD lead) by North, declarer (West) has 4 losers (1♠, 1♥, 1♠, 1♣). To make 4♠, West must win all four clubs. This happens when clubs break 3-3 or when you successfully find the ♣J in the North hand. In this case you win either way you choose to make 10 tricks and +420.

**Post Mortem** – This hand is one more example of how distribution trumps HCP. With 18 HCP E-W makes 4♠. Even if they can't win all four clubs and go down one it would be much better than letting the opponents make 4♥.

**Post Mortem II** – I note on this deal several E-W pairs were doubled at 4♠. Neither North nor South has enough defensive tricks for a double. Ironically just letting E-W play 4♠ undoubled yields an average + board for N-S in the open game.
