## Hand of the Week

This week features a Tuesday night deal where the opener＇s hand becomes much better after a trump fit is found：

Bidding－South with 16 HCP and 6 hearts opens 19 （12－21 HCP，5＋hearts）．North has heart support and 8 support points（ 7 HCP and one more for the doubleton）．They have a clear $2 \uparrow$ response（6－9 support points，3＋hearts）．With the heart fit confirmed South needs to reassess their hand．In hearts，their hand is worth 19 support point（ 16 HCP ， 2 for the singleton and one more for the extra heart）． Even if partner is on a minimum South knows they have 25－26 support point which is enough for game． South can rebid directly to $4 \vee$ ．

Play of the Hand－The standard lead from West will be the $\Phi Q$（Queen from QJ10）．On this lead，declarer （South）has 5 losers（1ヵ，1ヶ，1ヶ，2＊）．The spade loser can be trumped in the North hand．If you finesse for the \＆A twice you can eliminate a club loser．Doing this is not easy and many declarers not planning ahead at trick one will be trapped in the big hand and
lose two club tricks．If you use your $\mathbf{~} \mathbf{K}$ entry in dummy to lead clubs the first time，you can use a spade ruff in dummy later on to lead clubs a second time．After this，you can draw trump and find the $\vee$ falls on the second round to eliminate this loser．In all you get 11 tricks（ $2 \boldsymbol{*}, 6 \vee, 2 \Leftrightarrow$ plus a spade ruff）for +650 ．

Post Mortem－Always remember to add in your support points to the high card value of your hand when a trump fit it found．On this deal when hearts are trump the South hand can go to game when partner promises only a minimum hand in support．

Post Mortem II－Planning your play at trick one can be critical to getting every trick possible．On this deal if you wait to finesse clubs until after trumps are drawn you may be held to only 10 tricks instead of 11．In the NLM game this difference is worth 2 out of 6 masterpoints or $33 \%$ of your score for the hand．In the open game its 2 out of 5 masterpoints for $40 \%$ ．
