## Hand of the Week

This week features a Tuesday night deal where a third seat opener can open one of a major or NT. Either way getting to game can be tricky:

Bidding - West in third seat has 15 HCP and 5 spades. Some may open this 1NT (15-17 Balanced). With strength in my suit and aces I prefer to open this 14 ( $12-21$ HCP, $5+$ spades). After 1 $\mathbf{A}$, East has 11 support points for spades ( 9 HCP and 2 more for the singleton J). If you play the 2-way Drury Convention your bid is (limit raise in spades with 3 trump). If you do not play Drury but do play a forcing NT you can bid 1NT (Forcing) and then jump to 34 (limit raise in spades with 3 trump). If you play Standard

American without Drury consider bidding 3\& directly (limit raise in spades with $3-4$ trump). Be careful about bidding 2 and then jumping to 3 to show the 3 card spade raise. Partner opened in third seat and may pass your $2 *$ call. After any of these limit raise sequences, opener with a maximum hand (16 support points) can go to game.
If West opens 1NT - After 1NT East knows they have game values but needs a way to find out if partner opened with a 5 card major. Many people play a jump to $3 \&$ asks for a 4 or 5 card major (Puppet Stayman). West will rebid 3s showing their 5 card suit and East can bid on to game in 44. If you do not play this convention, you will likely end up in 3NT going down 1.

Play of the Hand - In 4 $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$, North will lead $¥ K$ ( $K$ from $K Q)$. On this lead, declarer (West) has 4 losers (2^, $2 \vee)$. Declarer can ruff one heart loser in dummy and finesse one of the opponents spade honors to save a second loser. On this play you only have 2 losers or 11 tricks for +450 .

Post Mortem - If you allow yourself to open in third and fourth seat light, make sure to discuss how to make limit raises. Consider playing a form of the Drury Convention to show limit raise support for major suits. Otherwise you may settle for part score when game is where you belong. If you open 1 NT with a 5 card major consider playing Puppet Stayman to help you reach 5-3 major fit games when they are right.
