## Hand of the Week

This week features a Tuesday night slam hand:

Bidding - East with 18 HCP and 6 hearts opens 18 (12-21 HCP, 5+ hearts). West has 13 HCP and should be looking for at least game. If you play Standard American you can respond 14 ( $6+\mathrm{HCP}, 4+$ spades). East will likely rebid $3 \uparrow$ (18-21 HCP, 6+ hearts). West with 2 hearts in support should now be thinking about slam possibilities. Partner can have many combinations to give you 12 tricks between the two hands. West should ask for key cards (4NT) knowing worst case they can safely play in $5 \vee$. When they find out they have all the aces, West can bid 6NT.
If you play 2/1 Game Force - After the 1V open, West can bid 2e (typically 5+ clubs, 12+ HCP, Game force). Having only 4 clubs is ok here. Passing up spades is ok too as partner will show a 4 card spade suit later on if they have one. In this case East will rebid $2 \vee$ ( $6+$ hearts). West with support and lots of prime values (Aces and Kings) can bid $3 \vee$ to establish the fit and start the exploration for slam. East can show their $\boldsymbol{A}$ by bidding $\mathbf{3}$. West shows the club ace with 4e. East shows the diamond ace with 4*. This should be all West needs to confidently look for key cards (4NT) to get to 6NT knowing they have all the aces and 3 kings.

Play of the Hand - Assuming North leads a diamond, declarer (West) has 9 winners (4↔, 2ヶ, 1४, 2ヶ) and can develop 3-4 more in the heart suit depending on capturing the VQ . As long as either the diamond or the heart finesse works you can make 12 tricks for +1440 . If you do not get a diamond lead or decide not to take the diamond finesse, you can make all 13 tricks for +1470 .

Post Mortem - Sometimes getting to slam requires a little faith that having the right amount HCP will work for you. On this deal East having a nice 6 card suit and extra values should be enough for West to at least ask for keycards knowing that worst case they can safely stop in $5 \vee$ if they are off a couple Aces.
