## Hand of the Week

This week features a Tuesday night deal that shows a reverse by responder:

Bidding - South with 12 HCP and 5 diamonds will open 1 (12-21 HCP, 3+ diamonds). West has 12 HCP but no 5 card suit and is too balanced for a negative double should pass. North has 14 HCP and should be thinking to reach game. With five hearts and fours spades our first bid is $1 \mathrm{H}(6+\mathrm{HCP}, 4+$ hearts $)$. South without 4 hearts to support partner or 4 spades to bid will rebid 1NT (12-14 HCP, balanced). North can now rebid 24. This bid promises at least 5 hearts and 4 spades and is forcing to game showing at least an opening hand. South with 3 hearts can now support partner with a $3 \downarrow$ call leaving room to explore for slam. North has a hand worth 16 support points and has some interest but should stop in $4 \vee$.
If you play New Minor Forcing - the bidding could also go $1 *-1 *-1 N T-2 \%^{*}$. $2 *$ is alertable showing at least 5 hearts and 10+ HCP. South will now bid $2 \vee$ to show 3 card support and a minimum opening hand. North can then go to game in $4 \vee$. That said I still like 24 instead of $2 \boldsymbol{*}$ here because it tells your partner more about your hand and helps access your slam possibilities.

Play of the Hand - Assuming a club lead against 4V, declarer (North) has 4 losers (2 $\mathbf{~} \mathbf{L}, 2 \boldsymbol{2}$ ). North best play is to attack spades to set up their KQ and get a ruff in dummy (short hand). Even if East overruffs with the queen you can now finesse the heart king with the jack to smother the 10 and lose no further hearts. This line of play will likely yield 11 tricks for +450 .

Post Mortem - When partner opens the bidding you as responder can show game forcing hands (12+ HCP) with $5+$ cards in a lower suit and 4+ cards in a higher suit by bidding the lower suit and then the higher suit. This is sometimes referred to as a reverse bid by responder. On this deal a reverse bid by responder helps you find your 8 card heart fit. Do not confuse a reverse bid by responder with a reverse by the opener. Openers typically need $16+$ points to reverse. They need more points because in most
auctions responder will have guaranteed fewer HCP than the opener, only 6+ HCP in most cases.
