## Hand of the Week

This week features a Friday deal that is a little tricky to reach your NT game and even trickier to make critical overtricks.

Bidding - Assuming East passes South with 15 HCP and 5 hearts will open 1 ( $12+\mathrm{HCP}, 5+$ hearts).

Bridge Association

North has 10 HCP and only 2 hearts and three spades. This correct rebid in Standard American is $2 \star$ (10-11 HCP as a passed hand, $5+$ Diamonds). South with their 15 HCP knows they have game values. Since partner is a passed hand there is little risk they bid $2 \star$ with 4 spades. South can bid 2 (Natural and Forcing) if they want to right side the 3NT contract and be sure clubs are stopped. North will then likely bid 2NT which can be raised to game in 3NT. (If you play Drury, then North will bid 2NT over 1Y).

If East opens 10 - South can overcall 14. North can advance the bidding with a 1 NT call (8-11 HCP, clubs stopped). South can invite to game with 2 NT which North should accept with their max 10 count and 5 card diamond suit.

Play of the Hand - On a 5 lead (fourth best) from East to West's queen taken by North's Ace, declarer (North) has nine winners ( $3 \boldsymbol{\wedge}, 5 \downarrow, 1 \boldsymbol{*}$ ) and game in hand. While declarer should fear a second club lead from West, if East opened declarer will be tempted to develop a heart overtrick putting AK in East's hand. This makes sense because if West has even the $\mathbf{Y K}$ East would have opened with 10 HCP or less. If West pitches a spade when you run diamonds you will also make an overtrick in spades.

Post Mortem - The bidding on this hand is trickier than you would expect. If South does not push for game it is very likely you will settle for part score and a bad result.

Post Mortem II - Even if you reach 3NT this will only get you an average result in the open game ( 6.5 out of 12). A good result requires you find a way to score an overtrick ( 9.5 out of 12 ). What can we say except bridge is a tough game.
