## Hand of the Week

This week features a Friday hand where you are a distributional 6-4 but belong in NT:

Bidding - North holding a distributional hand with 6 clubs, 4 spades and 16 HCP will open 1e (12-21 HCP, $3+$ clubs). South has 9 HCP and no 4 card major. With four solid diamonds they can respond $1 \diamond$ ( $6+$ HCP, 4+ diamonds). North will rebid 14 showing their 4 card suit. South without four card support can rebid 1NT (6-9 HCP balanced). South should not worry about having hearts stopped for this bid. Even if there is no stopper between the two hands and the suit runs you will still make 1 NT . After 1 NT by South, North can assume there is a club fit but 5 is not likely even if partner has 9 support points because you need 28 support points for this contract. How about 3NT? If partner has 8-9 HCP you have 24-25 HCP plus a nice 6 card club suit to run. Invite partner to game with a 2NT bid. South with a maximum 9 HCP holding will bid on to game at 3NT.

Play of the Hand - On a $\vee 5$ lead, declarer's play is put to the test right away. Normally when there is a doubleton honor in dummy we play up. This time is the exception to the rule. If you put up the $\mathbf{V}$ it loses to the $\vee \mathrm{A}$ and then opponents can capture your

$\geqslant$ Jith a finesse．Better to play small at trick one． Opponents are forced to take their $\vee A$ to set up the マK or play low to allow your $\vee \mathrm{J}$ to win．Either way you win a heart and that is all you need to make your contract as you now have 9 winners（14，1ヶ，1＊，6\％） for +600 ．

Post Mortem－Even long minor suit holdings often end up being played in NT．When evaluating NT prospects many players give themselves an extra point for a 5 card suit and 2 extra points for a 6 card suit．This is especially true when a minor suit fit is found．On this deal North＇s hand is worth 18 points when evaluated this way making the invite to game the right action．
