Bob Jones 3NT Hope that partner has his fair share of the missing high cards and bid 3NT.

Steve Vogel $\underline{X} \quad$ I am too strong for an immediate overcall of 2NT. I do not view 3NT as a good option for this hand, as that would suggest a long solid suit with a heart stopper. Despite the shortness in spades, double seems right to me. I then plan to bid notrump on my next call.

Steve Moese 3NT Give partner their 7 HCP and what contract do your want? I thought so. (Opener rates to have 7-8 on average leaving 12-13 to be split between partner and RHO. 25-26 HCP are likely enough to bid game).

Mike Ma 3NT Awhile back Mike Lawrence suggested bidding 3NT now as showing tricks (typically long m) and doubling then bidding 3NT as points. Playing Lebensohl put an end to that as partner with weak hand will bid 2NT first. In spite of 20 points, you are not happy with your hand in NT. You cannot hold up in H, and finesses require you be able to get to dummy. Nevertheless, give opener $\sim 7$ points, then partner has 6-7 on the average, so you really cannot not bid 3NT. It is not like you have a way for you to declare 2NT after finding out partner is bust.

But in MP I will go conservative as $2 N T+1$ may be just as good as $3 N T$ if $3 N T$ requires luck/skill. Playing 4 way transfer, $2 \boldsymbol{j}$ is what it takes to invite in NT. If the decision is to bid game, the question is whether to bid 3NT or $3 \boldsymbol{2}$ as some kind of Puppet Stayman. Steve Vogel 19 With just about all my points in the major suits, we may be better off playing in a suit. I would choose a 14 rebid even with my 4-3-3-3 shape. Also, if partner does not have a fit for spades, it would likely be best for notrump to be played from his/her side.

Joe Muenks 19 There are still some by-the-book bidders out there, like me. I do not play Walsh over a 1 or orening so I have to bid spades in case partner is minimum with 4 spades, the master suit.

Bob Fisk 19 I won't say I'll always bid 14 on this auction (5432 AKT KQT QJT), but I'm certainly going to bid 14 here. If you bid 1NT, you're going to feel silly when partner passes holding KQxx Qxxx QTxx x. Heh.

Steve Moese 1NT Rebidding 14 in expert 2/1 shows an unbalanced hand with 9+ black cards.

Mike Ma 1NT Do you bypass 4 spades and bid 1NT? You should have agreement with partner on that. It is popular to play that bidding 14 denies 4333, allowing responder to sign off in $2 \%$. But in these days of $X Y Z, 2 \%$ is conventional anyway, so I don't see what the difference is between 4333 and say 4234 . Some play that rebidding 14 promises unbalanced hand, so singleton (likely H) and/or 5 C. If you play that way, you better know the difference between $2 \boldsymbol{Q}$ by responder over 1 NT vs $2 \star$.
